ATTENTION LAUREL PARK RESIDENTS: THE LAST DAY TO PLACE HURRICANE HELENE DEBRIS IN THE RIGHT OF WAY IS THURSDAY, MAY 1, 2025

Henderson County is providing free curbside storm debris removal to all County residents. The County is working with a contractor to pick up all storm debris on DOT, municipal and private roads. The county is partnering with the municipalities within the County for this pickup service as well.

Storm debris that is pushed to the right of way of a property will be picked up. Thank you for your patience.

Storm debris includes tree branches, leaves, logs, building materials, furniture, paint, etc. Please separate household garbage, construction debris, vegetative debris, large appliances, electronics and hazardous waste to expedite the removal process. There is no need to take storm debris to the Transfer Station. The best way to remove debris is to place it on your curb. For more information please view this graphic.

we have our public and private lots picked up, the better protected we are from wildfires.

We encourage you to take this final opportunity to clear your properties of remaining storm debris, ensure correct sorting and place all debris in the rightof-way by May 1 for the most efficient and safest collection.

Gated Communities

Whether your gates are open or closed, gated communities need to send an email to helene-info@hcem.org requesting the County's FEMA Debris Contractor enter the subdivision to remove the debris. This request needs to reflect the consensus of the entire community.

Debris set out after May 1, 2025 will be the property owner's responsibility to dispose of and may be subject to code enforcement action.

Debris Sorting Guidelines:

- Vegetative tree limbs, branches, root balls, logs, etc.
- Construction & Demolition building materials; such as drywall, lumber, carpet, furniture, roofing, etc.
- Household Hazardous Waste paint, oil, batteries, chemicals, cleaning supplies, etc.
- Electronics television, computer, stereo, DVD player, etc.
- Large Appliances refrigerator, washing machine, dryer, dishwasher, etc. *APPLIANCE DOORS MUST BE SECURELY CLOSED*

Important Reminders:

- Only hurricane-related debris will be collected
- Do not bag ANY type of debris
- Avoid placing debris under trees, power lines, or in areas that could wash into a water way
- Bagged and loose leaves are not part of the hurricane debris
